I hope that we will have the honor of seeing you soon.

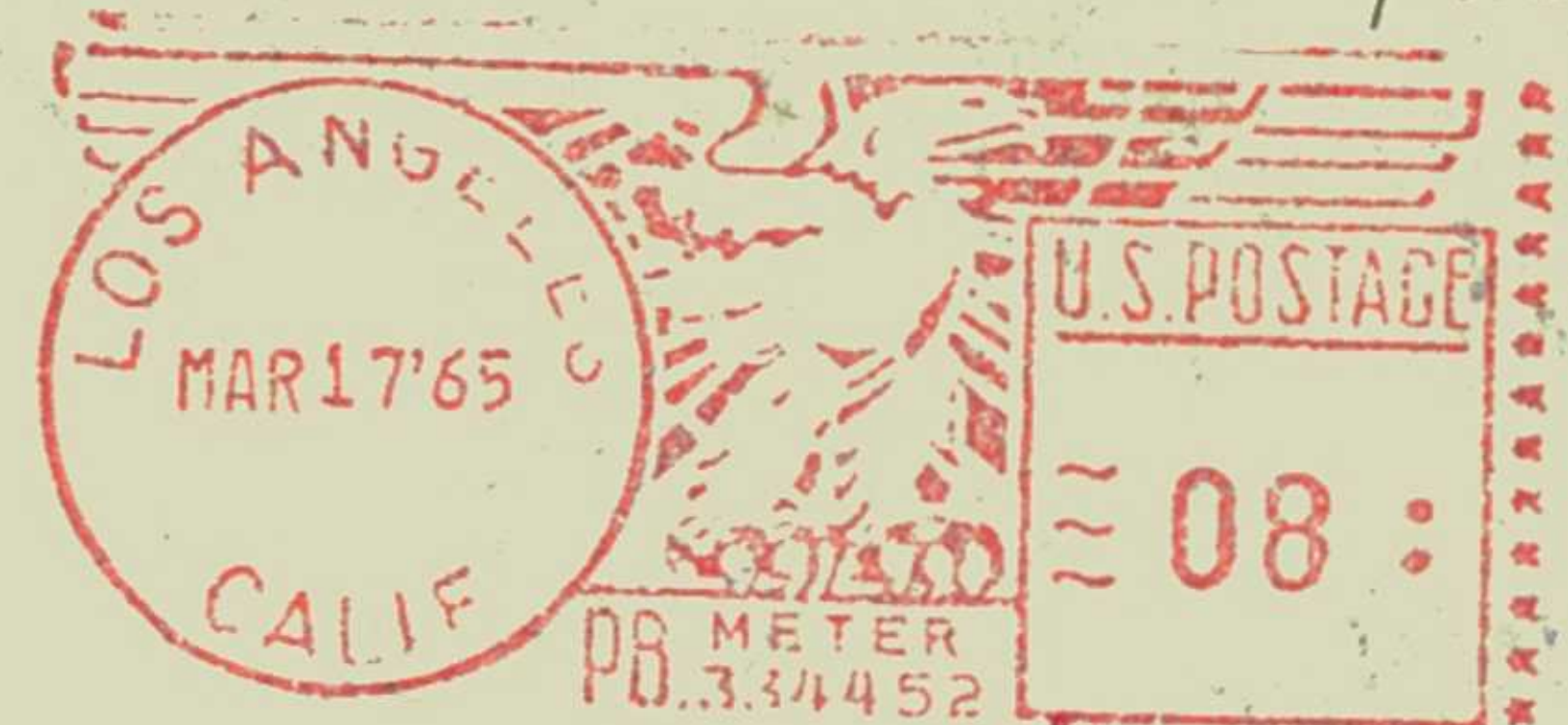
